Attendance for Year 8 started strongly but has begun to drop so it is time to turn this around and achieve above national average attendance as happened last year! Let's go for it Year 8!

Regular school attendance is not only important for academic progress, but also for nurturing friendships, supporting wellbeing and ensuring that every student has the opportunity to make the most of their time at school. Moments matters and attendance counts - every day brings new opportunities to learn, connect and grow, and we want every student to benefit from as many of these moments as possible.

Why #AttendanceMatters so much

Every day, and every lesson, presents a unique opportunity for learning. It is a chance to engage with new ideas, collaborate with peers and build upon knowledge and skills developed in previous lessons. When a student is absent, they may miss not only valuable learning but also the chance to develop friendships, participate in school life and benefit from the support of their teachers and peers.

Research consistently highlights the importance of regular attendance to achieve educational success. The Department for Education recognises that students who frequently miss school can face significant challenges in keeping up with their learning.

Below we have included information showing the impact attendance had on the GCSE outcomes of our Year 11 students last year. Attending in Year 8 can make a difference to final outcomes:
