Religion and Worldviews Learning Journey 2025-26

Our intentions for R&W can be broken down into three disciplines:

- 1. <u>Theology:</u> This provides students with the opportunity to "think through believing". Students will know about and understand a range of religions and worldviews. This is rooted in substantive knowledge which covers core content, concepts, which religions we study, the big ideas within these religions, giving students opportunities to gain knowledge, retain knowledge and retrieve knowledge of all religions and non-religions.
- 2. **Philosophy**: This provides students with the opportunity to "think through expressing". Students will express ideas and insights about the nature, significance and impact of religions and worldviews. This is rooted in disciplinary knowledge and addresses ways in which questions are asked and answered in R&W.
- 3. <u>Social Sciences</u> (including sociology and psychology). This provides students with the opportunity to "think through living". Students will gain and deploy the skills needed to engage seriously with religions and worldviews. This is known as personal knowledge (character development) and addresses how students articulate their views on religion and worldviews.
- Within each of these disciplines the intent of R&W and RS is to engage students in systematic enquiry into significant human questions
 which religion and worldviews address, so that they can develop the understanding and skills needed to appreciate and appraise varied
 responses to these questions as well as develop responses of their own.
